Personnel Procedures

AERONAUTICAL RATINGS, EMERGENCY SERVICES PATCH AND BADGES, AND GROUND TEAM BADGES

CAPR 35-6, 15 July 1999, is supplemented as follows:

1c. CAP Pilot Ratings will not be awarded until the individual is listed on the Wing-published Current Pilot's Listing as a fully qualified CAP pilot in accordance with CAPR 60-1.

1h. CAP Observer/Scanner Ratings will not be awarded until the individual appears on the MDWG 101 Card Listing as a qualified observer.

2. The CAP Emergency Services (ES) Qualification Badge will not be awarded until the individual appears on the CAP Senior Training Report as having achieved the necessary ES Officer specialty track rating, in accordance with CAPR 50-17. In the case of a senior who has filled up the Senior Training Report with other ratings and has no room to add his/her ES rating, a CAPF-2a approving the ES rating is the prerequisite to awarding the ES Qualification Badge.

3. The CAP Emergency Services (ES) Patch will not be awarded until the individual appears

on the MD Wing 101 Card Listing as qualified in at least one ES above General Emergency Services (GES).

4. Ground Team Badges will not be awarded until the individual appears on the MDWG 101 Card Listing as a qualified Ground Team Member, Ground Team Leader, or Ground Branch Director (formerly Ground Operations Director), as appropriate for the badge requested.

5c. Squadron commanders are the approving authority for the ratings, patches and badges in this regulation. Group Commanders are the approving authority for group staff members and squadron commanders in their groups. Commanders will use the MDWG-published Current Pilot's Listing and 101 Card Listing to verify Pilot, Observer/Scanner, ES, and Ground Team Ratings as listed previously in this supplement.
