CIVIL AIR PATROL UNIFORM MANUAL

CAPM 39-1, 1 July 1997, is supplemented as follows:

Table 2-2, Line 12 and Table 2-4, Line 13. Added. Under field conditions, an orange safety vest will be worn with the BDU uniform. The vest will be international orange in color, made of mesh (plastic or fabric), with a vertical stripe of reflective material, silver or yellow, approximately 1 1/4 inches wide, on each side of the front and back of the vest. The vest will be of front-closure, not over-the-head design.

3-8a. Male cadet officers may wear the Service Cap.

3-9a. Large size hat insignia is centered on the front of the cap - the same as the male service cap insignia (cadet or senior member), except with clutch (frog) backing. Female cadet officers may wear the all-blue Service Cap (the latter of the two listed).

3-8d and 3-9d. The ultramarine blue baseball cap, available from the bookstore, may be worn with the CAP jumpsuit and CAP (blue or orange) flight suits. Field Grade Officers (Majors through Colonel) may wear the ultramarine blue cap with cloud & lightning markings. No other color or style baseball cap may be worn with these uniforms. Organizational Emblems (group or squadron patches) may be worn on the ultramarine blue cap, centered 1/2 inch above the visor. No other ornamentation (wings, badges, etc) will adorn the baseball cap.

Table 5-3, Item 11. Organizational Emblem (Group or Squadron patches). Each group or squadron desiring to create a patch for their organization must submit to the Wing

Commander a request in writing, with a color drawing, defining every point, color, use, symbol and purpose of the patch. No patches shall be ordered or manufactured prior to written approval. The patch may be worn only on the BDU blouse as specified in Table 5-3, or on the ultramarine blue baseball cap worn with the CAP jumpsuit or CAP flight suit.

Table 5-3, Note 3. Added. No patch or badge not specified in Table 5-3 will be worn with any CAP uniform.

7-3a. The following shoulder cords are authorized. Members meeting the requirements have the choice either to wear or not wear a cord. Only one cord will be worn at a time. Cords may only be worn with the Air Force-style service uniforms (with or without service coat).

(1) Added. A WHITE shoulder cord may be worn by members of the current year Maryland Wing Drill Team and Maryland Wing Color Guard. The year will begin on the date of the Middle East Region Cadet Competitions. This cord may only be worn during performances, training sessions, and activities where the individual is performing duties as a member of the Drill Team or Color Guard.

(2) Added. A BLUE AND WHITE or a SILVER shoulder cord may be worn by members the Maryland Wing Honor Guard at the direction of the senior officer. This cord may only be worn during performances, training sessions, and activities where the individual is

performing duties as a member of the Honor Guard.

(3) Added. A YELLOW AND ULTRA-MARINE BLUE shoulder cord may be worn by members of the Maryland Wing Band. This cord may only be worn during performances, training sessions, and activities where the individual is performing duties as a member of the band.

(4) Added. A DARK GREEN shoulder cord may be worn by the Cadet of the Quarter for each squadron for the subsequent quarter after being chosen. The squadron may select the Cadet of the Quarter by any means deemed appropriate by the Squadron Commander. In

large squadrons, this cord may be worn by the Cadet of the Month.

7-3b,c,d,e,f. Drill Teams, Honor Guards and Color Guards may wear white leggings, white scarves, white gloves, white belts and white or silver helmet liners when performing ceremonial duties. These items will be removed at the completion of the activity.

7-3g. Berets will not be worn in Maryland Wing.

7-7. In Maryland Wing, only flight caps will be worn with the Air Force style flight suit.
